This means we can trace the journey from the manufacturer to the consumer's living room and we pass on this security to our customers when they fall in love with one of our sofas or chairs. Despite the fact that traceable leather is significantly more expensive, we have maintained the same prices so we can offer our customers a more sustainable product without it having to cost more. The fact that Porsche also uses the same leather type in their car production reinforces the high quality of our new traceable Quattro leather", says Lars Lyse Hansen.
